### Please remember...

If you are unable to serve on your scheduled day, it is up to YOU to find someone who will take over for you.

A triptych is a painting with three panels, often connected as by a hinge. In this month of January in the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Eighteen we commemorate three saints who are connected via God's grace. On January 25 we look upon the "middle panel" as we commemorate the Conversion of Saint Paul, recounted three times by Luke the Evangelist, the author also of the Book of Acts (see Acts 9, 22, and 26). On the day prior, January 24, we commemorate Saint Timothy (Pastor and Confessor) and on the day following, January 26, we commemorate Saint Titus (Pastor and Confessor). As with the crucifixion of our Lord, where there was a condemned criminal on either side of Christ, so too here with these three feast days we see that the one in the middle (in this case, Paul, who says of himself that he has been crucified with Christ and so it is no longer he [Paul] who lives, but Christ lives in him) has an impact on those all around him (i.e. Timothy and Titus, in this case).

Paul's conversion (and name-change from Saul) was vivid, dramatic, and put to use by Luke (Acts 9) and Paul (Acts 22 and 26) not as a personal spiritual biography, but as a way to promote and defend the Gospel of God's sheer grace. Neither Timothy nor Titus had such a spectacular story to share. They both came out of paganism (whereas Paul came out of Judaism) into Christianity via patient teaching of the Scriptures (initially, for Timothy, by his mother and grandmother, and later by Paul himself) and by means of baptism. Paul's conversion on the road to Damascus (and especially in his hearing of Ananias once in Damascus and the baptism given to Paul by that same Christian leader of the city) had a ripple effect in the lives of young men who lived in modern-day Turkey (Timothy lived in Lystra) and the island of Crete in the Mediterranean (for Titus).

This ripple effect from Christ to Paul to Timothy and Titus continued into the lives of many other early Christians. Paul had Timothy with him during his long stay in Ephesus (see Acts 19) and, according to tradition, eventually left him in Ephesus on his own way back to Jerusalem (see Acts 20) as the chief pastor of that important city. Titus was charged by Paul to serve as the chief pastor of his home-island of Crete, and there oversaw and appointed many other pastors around that island (see Titus 1). Even we have entered the chain that links Christ to Paul to Timothy and Titus in the fact that we have

three letters of the New Testament that Paul wrote under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to his two proteges and fellow-workers. In fact, Paul's words to Titus regarding baptism serve as the proving text for Luther's third question on the fourth chief part ("how can water do such great things?"). These words happen to be my favorite bible verse, and could also serve as a connector for all of us throughout this new year (since they are in the Scriptures, they teach on baptism [which we all share], and they are part of our common faith [as evidenced by their place in the Small Catechism and in our memory/heart]):

*"But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, Whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:4-7)."*

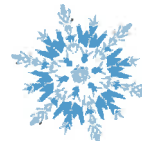

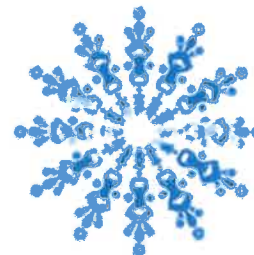
