Lent and Easter were busy but refreshing with the Lord's Word & Sacrament. Now the clouds of gloom are gathering on the horizon. Since the very time I arrived I have been warned by many about the felt emptiness of our worship attendance during Summer. As your new pastor I hope all that foreboding proves false! Surprise me with full pews, loud singing, and most of all-open ears to hear His Word.

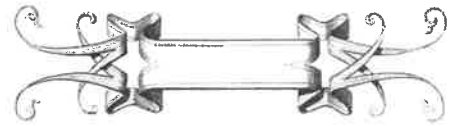
If not, I have *good news!* Satan has announced his intention to take a long overdue vacation from his never-ending work of lies and false doctrine, temptation and sin, despair and guilt. Instead of a Sabbatical- which sounds too pious and biblical- he's calling it a satanical. And since the prince of darkness likes to masquerade as an angel of light he is giving his whole demonic horde the summer off as well. It's not a year of Jubilee, per se, but a Beelzebulee! So take heart, my friends, this summer there will *not* be a devil around you, who with his lying and murdering, day and night normally keeps you from having any peace within or without!

*Disclaimer-* of course I'm being tongue-in-cheek. Satan does not take the summer off. He is not barred from your cabin at the lake. He can find his way onto a fishing boat, or a hiking trail, or any exotic locale. Even if he *did* take some time off, remember Luther's Christian Questions with their answers (LSB pages 329-330). Even without Satan in the picture we still have our flesh (believe what scripture says of it in Galatians 5 and Romans 7) and we are still in the world (John 15—16 and 1 John 2 and 5). So you will have just as much of a need for Christ's Word & Sacrament from June through August as you have had from September through May.

You do; you need Christ's justifying Word and His forgiveness in Holy Communion. For this reason Pastor Johnson and I, working with our Kantor, Dr. Rossow, have prepared a rich feast of His Word and the Church's song for you to receive with joy this Summer! We will make these Means of Grace available on Monday evenings all summer long, as well (every Monday at 7pm during June, July, and August). Allow me to preview the season following Pentecost & Trinity

Sunday and some of the special holidays during it – a Feast of His Word that will make your Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day barbecues seem like cheap, gas-station hot dogs by comparison!

This year Pastor Johnson and I have been using the *Lutheran Service Book's* “Historic (One-Year) Lectionary” and during this time of the Church Year it is noticeably different than the Three-Year series St. John’s has used in years past. The Three-Year series would take the next six months (before the new Church Year starts in Advent) to walk through one of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, or Luke) in sequential order. The Historic Lectionary, by comparison, seems to jump all over the place, but it does so to put together lessons from the Gospels around a unifying theme that relates to the major church holidays that fill these long six months between Pentecost and Advent.

So, beginning in June we will have several weeks that look back on the amazing Feast of Pentecost and these Sundays will teach us about different aspects of The Church of the Holy Spirit. The next big holiday then falls on Sunday, June 24<sup>th</sup> – the Birth (Nativity) of John the Baptist, six months before Christmas. Following that major holiday the Historic Lectionary gives us two short series of Gospel lessons that teach us about Christian Faith and Christian Love – major themes in the preaching of both John and Jesus!

By then the Summer will have ended, but the Trinity season goes on. September 29<sup>th</sup> gives us the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels. Following that feast, the lectionary gives us a three-week series on The Church Militant -together with God’s angels we wage spiritual warfare against Satan, the World, and our own sinful Flesh. After a festive Reformation Day and All Saints’ Day, the final weeks of the Trinity Season lean forward to the End- the End of the Church Year and the End of this Age. Indeed we are The Church of the End Times.

As your pastor I am thoroughly excited to celebrate these holidays with you. I look forward to studying these texts of Holy Scripture- not just the holiday ones, but the additional texts that make up these little series within the long, green-parament season. I actually get impatient out of eagerness, looking forward to preaching for you on such relevant and needed topics as (1) The Church of the Holy Spirit; (2) Christian Faith; (3) Christian Love; (4) The Church Militant; and (5) The Church of the End Times. Summer or not, let us not stop meeting together, but gather to hear Christ’s Word and receive His body and blood. I’ll see you on Sunday (or Monday)!

**TRINITY SEASON** – From ancient times the Church Year has had two halves: Festival Time (Advent - Pentecost) and Ordinary Time (Trinity Sunday - the Last Sunday of the Church Year). Our Historic Lectionary takes the Ordinary Time to group lessons together to teach on main topics related to the major festivals that occur during this half of the Church Year. So the first few weeks of the Trinity Season offer different doctrinal lessons on what the Church of the Holy Spirit (given at Pentecost) will look like.

Hears His Prophets (June 3)

Receives His Invitation (June 10)

Rejoices over Repentance (June 17)

and, Confesses the Faith & Catches Men (July 1)

**A HUGE THANK YOU** to all those who helped put up the abortion crosses and sign. Pray that hearts will be changed and babies' lives will be saved through this display.



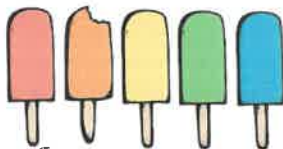

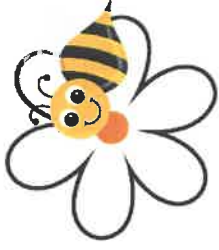
