At the end of the month (on September 29) we give thanks to God for His holy angels. In both the evening and morning prayer within the Small Catechism we pray that God would "let Your holy angel be with me that the evil foe may have no power over me." As we look back upon the past summer we should acknowledge that God's angels were with us in our travels and activities. This article will place before you a number of things regarding the holy angels.

First of all, though they are powerful they are not almighty. That belongs to God, the Maker of heaven and earth. In fact, the angels are creatures made by Him. We do not know on which day they were created, neither do we know when some of them rebelled against God and fell from their heavenly station. We do know that the fallen angels were led by Lucifer, the devil (Isaiah 14; Luke 10:18; Revelation 12:9), and that they fell before leading man into his fall away from God (Genesis 3). The angels are an indirect testimony to the doctrine of justification, in that they were given no opportunity to repent, whereas God is exceedingly patient with man, desiring that all people repent and come to a knowledge of the truth; so that all this might be ours for man God sent His own dear Son into the flesh in order to redeem us (see Hebrews 2:16).

The holy angels, with whom we will concern ourselves in the rest of this article, are important to us Christians also liturgically. The holy angels will never fall from their blessed state, they have been confirmed in their holiness in God's presence (see Matthew 18:10). These guardians of God's people on earth are invisible (see 2 Kings 6:17-20). When they do appear visibly in Scripture it is because God has sent them with a message at a particularly important moment in His plan of salvation for man (and when they do appear man is afraid, such that the first words out of the angel's mouth to the people they address are often "do not be afraid").

Notice, especially, their prominence around Jesus throughout His ministry (see Luke 1:30-33; Luke 2:9-13, 14; Matthew 2:19-20; Matthew 4:11; Luke 22:43; Matthew 28:2-6; Acts 1:10; Matthew 24:31—note also that many paintings or icons of Christ's baptism and His death on the cross include angels in the scene even though this is not *explicitly* mentioned in Scripture). In John 1:51 Jesus had told Nathaniel at the beginning of His ministry (and the beginning of Nathaniel's call to discipleship) that he



“would see the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man.” When the angels tell the people they are addressing to not be afraid they will sometimes add the reason the hearer should not fear, such as: “[fear not, for] *behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord* (Luke 2:10-11);” or, in another place “[do not be afraid] *for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as He said. Come, see the place where He lay* (Matthew 28:5-6).”

As was said earlier, the angels play an important role for us Christians liturgically, as both they and us worship the Triune God. They are depicted in both the Old and New Testament writings as worshipping God upon His throne (see Isaiah 6 or Revelation 4 and 5). Paul also mentions that they are invisibly present in the worship of the gathered Christian congregation here on earth (see 1 Corinthians 11:10 and Hebrews 12:22f). The Proper Preface for the feast of St. Michael and All Angels (on St. Michael see Daniel 10:13f; Daniel 12:1; Revelation 12:7-9; and Jude v. 9) states: “through [Jesus Christ, our Lord] Your majesty [O Father] is praised by all the holy angels and celebrated with one accord by the heavens and all the powers therein [a borrowing from the Te Deum, where it reads ‘to You all angels cry aloud, the heavens and all the powers therein, to you all cherubim and seraphim continually do cry (followed by the Sanctus of Isaiah 6)’].”

The Collect for the Day notes how God has “ordained and constituted the service [or ministry] of angels and men in a wonderful order.” In Scripture angels are often found announcing a message from God (the word angel means “messenger”); similarly, men are likewise spokesmen for God (the apostles, prophets, and even pastors of local congregations—see Revelation 1 and 2). In Scripture angels are often found defending the people of God; similarly, human beings defend the bodily life of other human beings, and such defenders are like an angel. All of this is to say that God works through means and through creatures (like heavenly angels or human beings) to bless other human beings. He is the giver of life and the one who determines its end (for people), no creature ultimately has this power. It is His own Word that is spoken, it belongs to God and not to us nor to an angel. In fact, we ultimately would want to acknowledge that God is the true Speaker of His Word so that we might be the ones who hear, repent, believe, and rejoice now on earth by faith and one day in heaven (with all the saints and holy angels) by sight.

GIVE+ E-Giving at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church



NEW GIVING OPTIONS: We are excited to now offer three electronic giving options for St. John's stewardship! *Online giving* has been in place for some time (formerly known as Simply Giving...re-branded as the Give+ electronic giving program of Vanco Payment Solutions), but now St. John's has introduced two more elements of that program: *The Mobile App* and *Text*. As convenient alternatives to envelope offerings, all of these options are fast, more secure, and manageable for one-time or repetitive contributions, *and* you can direct your money to any of St. John's current giving funds! No longer do you have to carry cash or checks to make contributions – and, if you are unable to give in person while out ill, on vacation, or business, you can initiate a transaction anytime, anywhere! Additionally, when there are special giving opportunities, attending congregational social events, or responding to special appeals, your supplemental discreet gift can easily be submitted. When you participate in electronic giving, you may still want to demonstrate your stewardship during services; so our offering plate cards (that read "I give electronically") are available to drop in the offering plate as it is circulated.

In weeks to come, expect postings on Facebook and our website. While traditional envelope offerings are still an option, any donations made electronically provide accurate record posting, and do not require the tedious manual handling of the money counting process, or endure the physical environment of bank check processing. St. John's relies on the financial support of the congregation and electronic giving offers an easy way to give on a recurring basis; please consider setting up a recurring giving plan. By knowing what you are willing to commit financially, we are able to better plan for the future.

New members will be advised of our giving method options, and guests/non-members will have the ability to contribute anywhere, anytime and have a record of their donation. *You are encouraged to utilize any and all of the ways now available to you for giving to St. John's Lutheran Church.* Members will receive a statement at the end of the year that will reflect your total combined giving by fund distribution.

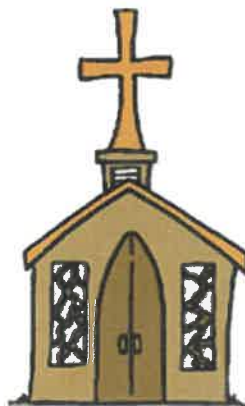
