The "Every Week in Lent" Challenge

This church year has a theme or focus of "a renewal of membership." We pastors want to see the Lord's Word & Sacrament make it to every one of our households this church year *and with increasing frequency*. We are about to embark on a very important part of that year-long emphasis – the Every Week in Lent Challenge.

Weekly attendance is the best practice for Christians, both because it is commanded by God and because He Himself makes many great promises to us where His Gospel is preached and His Supper received. Often in conversation we pastors discover that there are not hard & fast reasons *against* attending that often. People claim to be too busy, too lazy, too tired, and many other excuses (and they admit they're just excuses). All of that can be summarized with the phrase "Bad Habits".

We all know the benefits of establishing good and healthy habits from hygiene to exercise and especially sleep. We also know the great detriments to our physical and mental health that come with each and every bad habit we have. This is not just true of our bodily life, but our spiritual life as well.

Dear readers, I can go out on a limb and say *all of us* (pastors included) have developed **bad habits** that we can and should break for the sake of our souls. For one family it may be that attendance at the Divine Service is *not* weekly or with any regularity at all. It is completely haphazard, arbitrary, and controlled by many factors that are not "What has God said about this." For others it may be a regular life of prayer or family devotions in the home. For another regular Bible reading is tried and constantly shipwrecked on the bad habits that get in the way.

Replacing bad habits with good habits can be hard. That's why we call this the Every Week in Lent **CHALLENGE**. Yet we all know it is possible to break bad habits and establish new good ones. While the good habits often bring benefits all on their own, we Christians can learn and apply from the outside world that setting some goals for our families and setting a Reward can be a powerful aide in accomplishing that new and better life habit.

When I moved up here as your pastor I was not in very good physical shape. My exercise options were pretty limited in our rural town of Iowa. Eventually I got a pool membership at the Community Center here in Maple Grove and set out on a habit of regular exercise. Obviously, the health and physical benefits are a reward in and of themselves, but adding a fun reward made it easier for me and even for my wife in encouraging me to go. We would have a special breakfast if I made it a

month without skipping. We continued that month after month until it was regular.

THAT is what I want your family to try this Lent. Obviously weekly attendance at the Divine Service – and making that a habit that doesn't stop – will have innumerable benefits. That's why our Lord has commanded it and attached His promises to it! And if you want to make that the *only* reward, then go for it. But, if you are like the rest of us mortals, and need a little added encouragement within your family, then set that goal – Every Sunday in Lent – and then give yourselves an Easter Sunday *reward*.

Be creative and tailor it to your family. Share it with your pastors if you like, we'd love to hear what you come up with! Maybe the best reward will be a brunch out at a restaurant you wouldn't normally splurge on. Perhaps it would be a new board game for the family to enjoy on the first family game night after Easter. If you're a single person perhaps it's a book or movie or other reward. Again, the key is to use these rewards to *serve* the greater good of replacing a bad habit with a good one. And that good habit once in place will be self-supporting and sustaining for a long time!

If it doesn't happen, return to the Lord with the appropriate repentance, seeking His grace, and remembering we are not *justified* by our works. And then try it again: Every Sunday of Easter (Apr. 9 – May 28), then June and July, etc. etc. etc. Lent is a great time to start this, but the goal is to finish it wherever, whenever, however you can. Of all the bad habits you can drop and all the good habits you can achieve a regular diet of Word & Sacrament **IS.THE.BEST!** habit to adopt. Our health, hygiene, and fitness habits only affect this bodily life. The Divine Service and this healthy habit will bear eternal results!

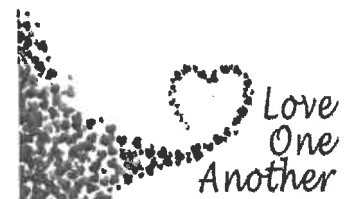
With a new Confirmation Class gearing up for their May examination I will be challenging all of their families to take this Challenge as seriously as they can, and for the confirmand make the reward as big to match the occasion. On that first Sunday in May they will all vow – as you have – that they “desire to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper in this congregation *faithfully*.” This challenge will be the best way to prepare for and “prove it” to themselves and their families.

Weekly attendance is not *unachievable*. Your sleep-habits, your busy schedules, all the excuses are so much less powerful than you often give them credit. Put them in their place with the good habit and godly discipline of attending the Divine Service each Sunday from February 26 through April 9. You'll no doubt come back the weeks following, too.

Total revenue short \$32K compared to budget

- Tuition short of budget by \$18K; Other school income favorable \$7K over budget (mainly ESP income)

Total expenses a favorable \$41K under budget

- Salary and benefits under budget by \$54K primarily due to not filling 5th grade teacher role and fewer than expected employees needing health coverage helping to offset other areas with higher-than-expected operating costs.

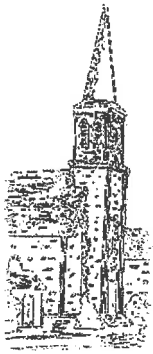

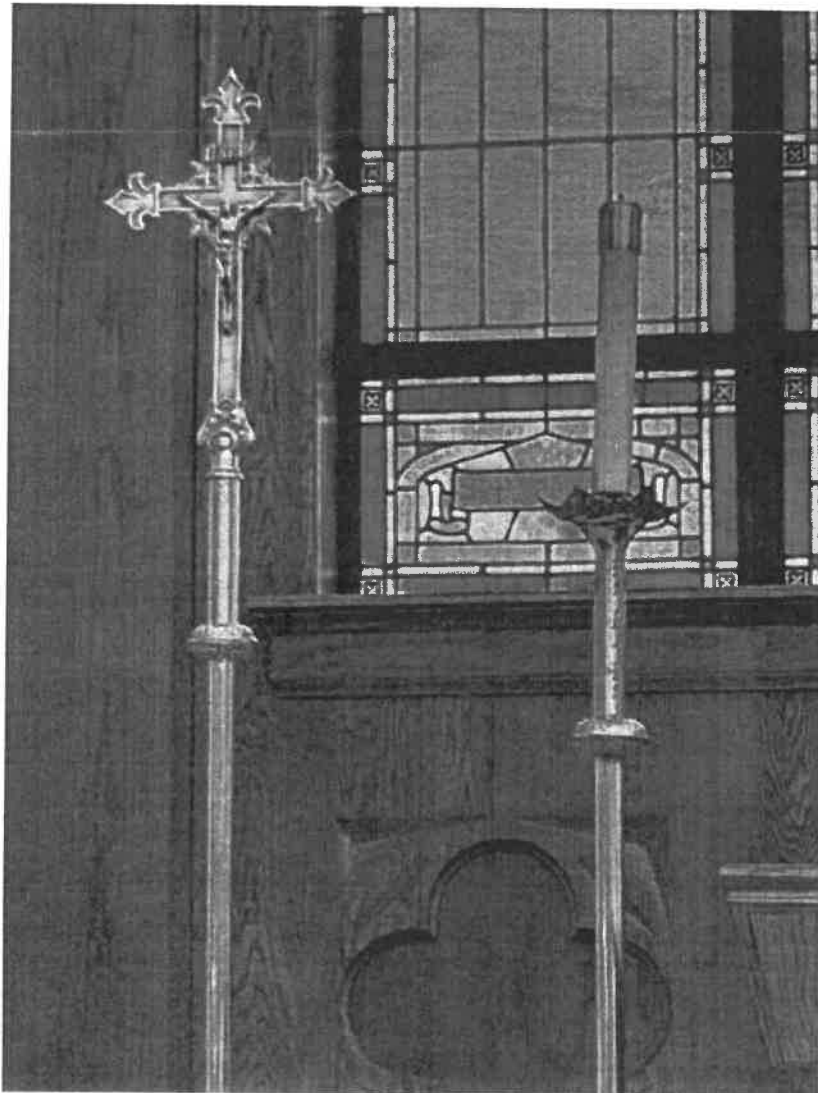

Did you Know:

- Altar Guild was organized in 1976 under Pastor Heimlich. There are two Charter members still active in the Guild: Vivian Radintz and Jan Stieg.
- The Scarlet Parament placed on the altar for Maundy Thursday is 93 years old. It was made by the ladies of St. John's in 1929 after all of the paraments were lost to the fire in 1927.
- The Processional Cross and Processional Candles we use today are the original Crucifix and Candle Holders used on the Altar prior to being saved from the fire of 1927.

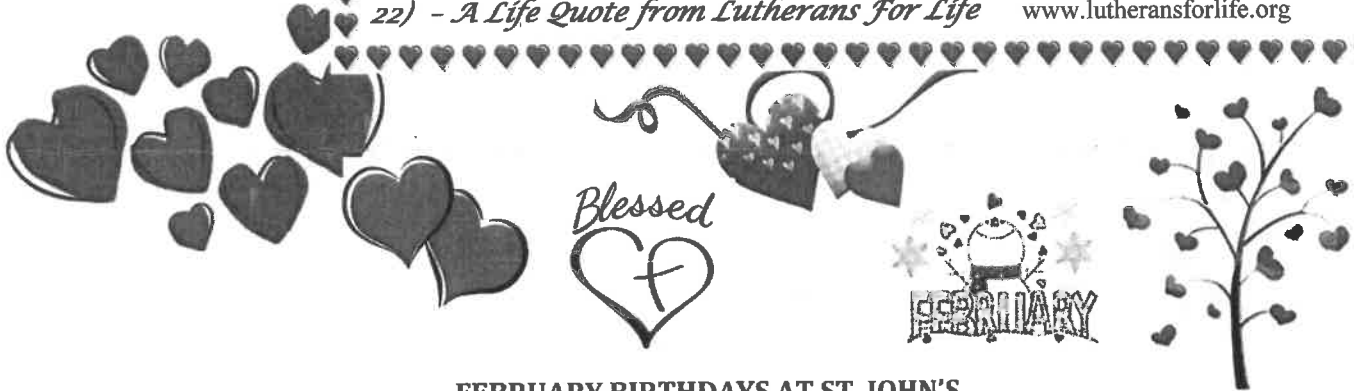
