Membership at St. John's, Part I

Being or becoming a member of a local congregation is a very important thing. It is important because membership in the Church as the Body of Christ is vital to our life and salvation. To connect the dots between "the Church" and the "local congregation" should be easy enough. Just look for the "marks of the Church". Are the pastors of this congregation preaching and teaching God's Word purely and truly? And are the sacraments that Christ instituted being administered according to how He gave them?

If so, then that local organization, that local gathering of preacher(s) and hearers *is* Church. You may boldly say, "Here is where I and my fellow believers of God's Word gather together (literally, congregate) to hear God's Word and receive His sacraments!" To be sure, even hypocrites or unbelievers can attend and join as members in the visible, earthly organization of a congregation. That does not make them members of the Body of Christ, the *invisible* or hidden Church which is made up exclusively of those who have true and saving faith—such are known only to God.

However, this reality that the church on earth will have hypocrites and unbelievers mixed into it does not then mean that membership in the earthly church, the local congregation, is therefore meaningless. That's logically absurd! The abuse of a thing never negates the right use of it. We pastors at St. John's will be taking a lot of time and putting in a lot of effort in the months to come to emphasize the importance of Church Membership. Let's get started!

"Membership" in the Bible – Church & Congregation

I begin every adult catechism class (for prospective members) by sharing what the Bible means when it talks about membership. First, I give some examples of what it is not. Church membership is not like a Sam's Club membership where you *can* shop there, but also obviously shop elsewhere. It's not like a gym membership or country clubs.

When the Bible talks about "membership" it means members of a body, and my arm cannot be my arm and someone else's arm simultaneously. Even with an organ transplant the organ cannot be in two bodies at once. It's my kidney or it's your kidney. It can never be "our kidney".

From there I go over the Bible passages that speak of membership in the Body

of Christ, the Church. And I encourage you to read all of them: Ephesians 3:6 and 5:29-30; 1 Corinthians 12:12-31; and Romans 12:3-8. As you read these passages you'll notice it is difficult- or impossible- to separate "the Church" in the invisible sense from the local congregational sense. That's how it should be! Again, the reality of hypocrites or unbelievers mixed in to the church on earth does not negate the importance of the true believers (Church) attaching themselves to the local congregation of the Body of Christ.

If you've read those passages, especially the longer ones from 1 Corinthians and Romans, I think you'll understand quite easily our St. John's Constitution's definition of membership, "Members shall include all those who have received a valid Christian Baptism according to the Word of the Triune God and who are under the Spiritual care of the Pastor(s) of this congregation, including the children who have not yet been confirmed (Constitution, Article III, A.)."

Faithfully receiving the Word and Sacraments of Christ is what makes one a member of "the Church." So, quite rightly, our Constitution states that members *of this congregation* will be those who have received the Sacrament of Baptism and are hearers of the preached Word in this congregation. Members are the baptized who will regularly, faithfully receive the absolution, preaching, and teaching of the Word through the called and ordained Ministers of the Word that Christ has given to the Church *in this place*. We do not all have the same function in this body, but we are yet members together of it.

Next month I will go over "The Catechism and Confirmation" as a necessary part of membership, as it *reveals* just how we are unified in this One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism (Eph. 4:5). From there I will share some of the plans and projects your pastors and Board of Spiritual Life have for the near future, as we seek to address challenges that are facing us and problems- some of our own creation- that have diminished the value of "Church Membership". In the meantime, continue to faithfully attend the Divine Service, and encourage others to do the same, for this is where Christ Himself feeds, nourishes, and cares for His own body with His gracious Word and blessed Sacraments.

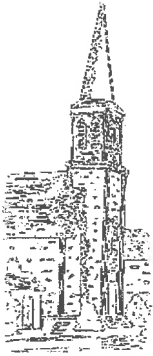

- Pastor John Fackler was ordained and installed as pastor at St. John's on August 28, 1876.
- Pastor Fackler served St. John's for almost 46 years, until his death from a heart attack on August 3, 1922.
- Both Pastor Fackler and his wife Auguste (who died in 1942) are buried in our St. John's cemetery – just west of the top access road and approximately at the midpoint of the cemetery.
- Many firsts occurred during Pastor Fackler's service to St. John's, including the first barn being built for a cost of \$18.

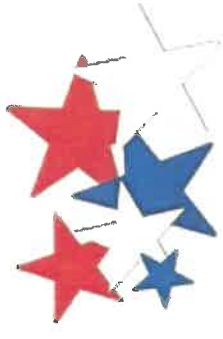
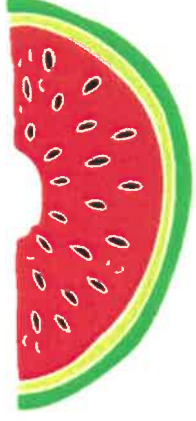
